any time hereafter connect and to consolidate its stock or management or both, with such corporation or corporations, and to make contracts for the operation or management of the lines of any such connecting corporations and any such connecting corporations may lease or sell their own railroads, franchises, privileges, immunities or property to this, the said Carrabassett and Canadian Railroad Company, and may make contracts for the operation or management of the lines of the latter, and in either event either of the foregoing corporations may respectively accept such lease, sale or contract, provided, however, that no lease or sale of the Carrabassett and Canadian Railroad Company shall be made except on a stock vote of not less than two-thirds of the whole amount of the issued capital stock of the corporation.

-proviso.

SECT. 3. The capital stock of this corporation shall not exceed twelve thousand shares of one hundred dollars each.

Capital stock.

SECT. 4. The name of this corporation is hereby changed from the Carrabassett and Canadian Railroad Company to the Atlantic and Canadian Railroad Company.

Name changed.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 256.

An Act to amend chapter two-hundred and fifty of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, relating to taking of Alewiv s in Bagaduce River and Walker's Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and fifty of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is hereby amended by inserting after the word "net" in the first line thereof the words 'and weirs,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

Sec. 11, ch. 250, Private and Special Laws of 1887, amended.

'SECT. 1. The taking of alewives, except by hand dip net and weirs between Johnson's Narrows and the head of Walker's or Gray's pond, so called, is hereby prohibited, under a penalty of ten dollars for each fish so taken or caught in violation of this act.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
