Chapter 266.

An Act to prohibit the taking of fish from Cook's Brook and Pearce's Brook in Houlton, Aroostook county, for the term of four years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

All persons are forbidden fishing for and taking any fish from the waters of Cook's brook and its tributaries, or Pearce's brook in Houlton, Aroostook county, Maine, for the term of four years from the first day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five. Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars, or in default thereof by imprisonment of not less than ten or more than thirty days. The fines and penalties provided by this act may be recovered on complaint, before any trial justice in Aroostook county.

Fishing, prohibited for four years.

Chapter 267.

An Act to protect trout in the ponds and streams in the town of Troy, in the county of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. No trout shall be caught, taken or destroyed from any of the ponds, brooks or streams in the town of Troy, county of Waldo, for a period of two years.

Trout, not to be taken for two years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense and one dollar additional for every trout taken, caught or destroyed, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in the county of Waldo, one-half of said fines to go to the complainant and the other to the county where the complaint is made.
