Chapter 268.

An Act to prohibit the taking of fish in Little Tunk Pond, so called, in plantation Number Seven, Hancock county, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Fish, not to be taken for four years.

SECT. 1. No person shall take, fish for, kill or destroy any fish in Little Tunk pond, so called, situated in plantation Number Seven, Hancock county, Maine, at any time within four years from the approval of this act.

—penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall pay a fine of ten dollars and shall further pay the sum of one dollar for each and every fish so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice or municipal court.

Chapter 269.

An Act for the protection of Fish in Southerland Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Fish, not to be taken for four years.

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind from Southerland pond, so called, in the town of Webster, county of Androscoggin, for the period of four years from the first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

—penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be liable to a fine of not exceeding ten dollars for each offense, and a further fine of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in Androscoggin county, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the county of Androscoggin.
