CHAP. 292

May sell or
lease its lines.

SECT. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized to connect its lines with those of any other company, or to sell or lease its line, either before or after its completion, to any other telephone or telegraph company upon such terms as may be mutually agreed upon, which sale or lease shall be binding upon the parties, or to purchase or lease any other line or lines of telegraph or telephone, upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

Capital stock.

SECT. 5. The amount of the capital stock shall be fixed by vote of the corporation, but not to exceed the amount that may from time to time be necessary for the purposes herein specified, but not to exceed ten thousand dollars, and said corporation may purchase, hold, sell and convey real estate and personal property necessary for the purposes contemplated in this charter.

First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 6. Any one of the corporators named in this act may call the first meeting of this company, by mailing a written notice to each of the other corporators, seven days at least before the day of meeting, naming the time, place and purposes of such meeting; and at such meeting a president, secretary, treasurer and directors may be chosen, by-laws adopted, and any corporate business transacted.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 292.

An Act to extend and amend the charter of the South West Harbor Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter ex-
tended.

SECT. 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the South West Harbor Water Company which were granted by chapter three hundred ninety of the private and special laws for the year eighteen hundred ninety-three, are hereby extended for two years additional, and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said acts, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes and such additional rights, powers and privileges as are granted in this act.

SECT. 2. Section two of said act, chapter three hundred and ninety of the private and special laws for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "Lurvey springs," the words 'and certain artesian wells,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 2. Said company for said purposes may flow, detain, collect, take, store, use and distribute water from Long pond or Lurvey springs and certain artesian wells on the lands of J. A. Freeman, all in said Tremont, and streams flowing in and out of the same, and may locate, construct and maintain dams, cribs, reservoirs, locks, gates, sluices, aqueducts, pipes, hydrants and all other structures therefor.'

May take
water, etc.

SECT. 3. The South West Harbor Water Company is hereby empowered and authorized to raise money for its corporate purposes by the issue of bonds to be secured by mortgage on the property, franchise and privileges of said corporation. Said bonds shall be issued in sums not less than fifty dollars each, but the total amount of the bonds so issued shall not exceed the capital stock actually subscribed for.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 293.

An Act to incorporate the Wilton Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. George H. Bass, N. W. Sewall, M. L. Bass, J. D. Furnel and W. H. Chamberlain, with their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation, by the name of the Wilton Water Company, for the purpose of conveying to and supplying Wilton village with pure water for domestic, sanitary, fire and municipal purposes.

SECT. 2. Said company for said purposes may detain, take, store and distribute water from any ponds, springs, streams or other waters in said Wilton except Wilson pond situated in the town of Wilton, in the county of Franklin, and may locate, construct and maintain dams, reservoirs, sluices, aque-
