Chapter 3.

Resolve declaring the Pine Cone and Tassel to be the floral emblem for Maine, in the National Garland of flowers.

Resolved, That the Pine Cone and Tassel is hereby declared to be the floral emblem for Maine, in the National Garland of flowers.

Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of the Maine General Hospital.

Resolved, That there be and is appropriated the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars, to be paid to the Maine General Hospital for the use of said institution for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and seven thousand five hundred dollars, to be paid to said institution for its use for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Chapter 5.

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on the State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to pay to W. M. Cook, chairman of the joint standing committee on the State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, two hundred and eight dollars, the same being the amount paid by him for the expenses of the said committee, and the committee on agriculture, and the committee on education, on their recent visit to that institution, as ordered by the legislature.
