Resolve in favor of Mrs. Dorothy Stevens.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Mrs. Dorothy Stevens of Lee, a pension of ten dollars per month, beginning January one, eighteen hundred and ninety-five.

Chapter 11.

Resolve in favor of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Maine, department for securing homes for homeless children.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be, and hereby is appropriated for the use of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Maine to be used by the department for securing homes for homeless children of which five hundred dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and five hundred dollars during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

Chapter 12.

Resolve in favor of the Bangor Children's Home.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars per annum for the years of eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six be, and is hereby appropriated in aid of the Bangor Children's Home, to be paid by the state treasurer from any funds not otherwise appropriated.
