CHAP. 13**Chapter 13.**

Resolve in favor of Town of Marion.

Marion, in  
favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be and is hereby appropriated annually for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six, to assist the town of Marion to maintain roads and bridges in said town and that the money be expended under the direction of the county commissioners.

Approved February 11, 1895.

**Chapter 14.**

Resolve in aid of the Temporary Home for Women and Children in Deering.

Temporary  
Home for  
Women, in  
favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of two thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the use of the temporary home for women and children at Deering; of which one thousand dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and one thousand during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

**Chapter 15.**

Resolve in favor of the Committee on Education.

Harrison  
Hume,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer be directed to pay to Harrison Hume, chairman of said committee, the sum of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, the same being the amount paid out for expenses of the committee on its recent visits to the Farmington Normal School, Gorham Normal School, and School for the Deaf and Dumb at Portland.
