Chapter 54.Resolve in favor of Cherryfield Academy. Cherryfield
Academy, in
favor of.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars per year, for the years one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, to be paid to the trustees of Cherryfield Academy, an institution of learning situated in Cherryfield, in the county of Washington, for the use of said academy.

Provided, however, that the appropriation is made on the express condition that the trustees of said institution shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first class academy; and provided further, that the governor and council and superintendent of schools shall have a right at all times to visit said school when the same shall be in operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and council, said institution at any time hereafter shall fail to fulfill the conditions contained in the resolve, they may in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted.

Chapter 55.Resolve in favor of Monmouth Academy. Monmouth
Academy, in
favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars yearly, for two years, be and hereby is appropriated to Monmouth Academy, an institution of learning located in the town of Monmouth, in the county of Kennebec.

Provided, however, that this appropriation is made upon the express condition that the trustees of said institution shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first class academy, of not less than three terms of ten weeks each during each year; and provided further, that the governor and council and superintendent of common schools shall have a right at all times to visit said school when the same shall be in operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and council said institution shall at any time hereafter fail to fulfill the condition of this resolve, they may in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted.
