Chapter 56.

Resolve in favor of Wilton Academy.

Wilton Acad-
emy, in
favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars is hereby annually appropriated for the term of two years to Wilton Academy, an institution of learning in the town of Wilton, in the county of Franklin.

Provided, however, that the appropriation is made on the express condition that the trustees of said institution shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first class academy; and provided further, that the governor and council and superintendent of common schools shall have a right at all times to visit said school, when the same shall be in operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and council, said institution at any time hereafter shall fail to fulfill the conditions contained in this resolve, they may in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted.

Chapter 57.

Resolve in favor of Mrs. Mary Ann Sleeper.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Mrs. Mary Ann Sleeper of Rockland, dependent mother of Otis H. Sleeper, late of company B, Third Regiment of Artillery, New York Volunteers, a pension of ten dollars per month, beginning January first, eighteen hundred and ninety-five.

Chapter 58.

Resolve in favor of Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated from the funds in the state treasury, the sum of seven thousand dollars for the use of the Maine Industrial School for Girls at Hallowell, to meet the current expenses for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and seven thousand dollars to meet the current expenses for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
