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**Chapter 77.**

Resolve in favor of the road in Washington plantation, so called, and Perkins plantation, so called, in Franklin county.

*Resolved*, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin county, in repairing the road leading from Wilton to Weld through Washington plantation, so called, and Perkins plantation, so called, in said plantations in Franklin county. But said money shall not be paid until said commissioners have produced satisfactory evidence to the governor and council that they have raised and expended a like sum on said road.

**Chapter 78.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to sell and convey all the interest of the State of Maine in and to seven acres of land in Freeport, Maine, forming the western part of Williams' Island.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to sell all the interest which the state of Maine has in and to seven acres of land more or less, in Freeport, Maine, forming the western part of Williams' Island, and convey the same to Thomas J. Mann and heirs of James Mann for the sum of five dollars.

**Chapter 79.**

Resolve in favor of the Town of Dexter.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the town of Dexter six hundred and four dollars and forty-six cents, it being for state tax erroneously collected from said town for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-three and eighteen hundred and ninety-four.
