Chapter 114.

Resolve for a memorial commemorating the patriotism of John Baker.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of removing the body of John Baker from British soil to the town of Fort Fairfield and erecting a suitable monument commemorating the patriotism, courage and sufferings of the said John Baker.

Chapter 115

Resolve in favor of the Committee on Military Affairs.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to pay to the chairman of the committee on military affairs the sum of thirty-seven dollars, being the amount of expense of said committee in visiting the Bath Naval and Military Orphan Asylum, in accordance with the vote of the legislature.

Chapter 116.

Resolve providing for the distribution of educational documents by the State Superintendent of Common Schools.

Resolved, That there be appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and five hundred dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six, to be paid out of the school funds of the state under the direction of the governor and council, for the purpose of preparing and distributing among the teachers of the common schools and school officers of this state, outlines, suggestions and directions concerning the management, discipline and methods employed in teaching, for the purpose of promoting improved systems of instruction. Said outlines, suggestions and directions to be prepared and distributed by the state superintendent of common schools.
