Chapter 125.

Resolve in relation to the dedication of the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park.

Resolved, That if the governor shall deem it advisable for the state to be represented at the dedication of the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park, he shall take such action as may be necessary therefor, and to defray the expenses thereof, if any, he is authorized to draw his warrant upon any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 126.

Resolve in favor of the State Reform School.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty thousand five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the State Reform School for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six for the following purposes: For the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, for current expenses including mechanical school and Farrington cottage, nineteen thousand dollars; finishing wall and fence, four hundred dollars; to complete painting buildings, six hundred dollars; to purchase laundry machinery and dry room, fifteen hundred dollars; ordinary repairs, one thousand dollars. For the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six, for current expenses including mechanical school and Farrington cottage, nineteen thousand dollars; for ordinary repairs, one thousand dollars; and for the construction of a new cottage, eight thousand dollars.
