Chapter 259.

An Act to establish Bank Holidays, and to abolish Days of Grace on commercial paper.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Bank holidays. • Sect. 1. Any day of public fast or public thanksgiving, appointed by the governor and council, or by the president of the United States, the first day of January, the twenty-second day of February, the thirtieth day of May, the fourth day of July, the first Monday of September and the twenty-fifth day of December, are hereby declared to be bank holidays.

Days of grace, abolished.

- -act shall not apply to sight drafts.
- Sect. 2. No days of grace, according to the custom of merchants, shall be allowed on any promissory note, draft, check, bill of exchange, bond or other evidence of indebtedness made, drawn or accepted after this act shall take effect, unless expressly stipulated therein, but the same shall be due and payable as therein expressed, without grace; provided, that this act shall not apply to any draft or bill of exchange drawn payable at sight.

Notes, etc., falling due on Sunday or any bank holiday, shall be payable next succeeding business day. Sect. 3. Any promissory note, draft, check, acceptance, bill of exchange, bond or other evidence of indebtedness made, drawn or accepted after this act shall take effect, that shall fall due on Sunday or any bank holiday, shall be payable and presentable for payment on the secular or business day next succeeding such Sunday or holiday. If a bank holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be deemed a bank holiday for the purposes of this act.

Section 9, chapter 32, R. S., repealed.
When act shall take

effect.

- Sect. 4. Section nine of chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.
- Sect. 5. This act shall take effect July one, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.

Approved March 23, 1897.
