Chapter 230.

Resolve in favor of Children's Aid Society of Maine.

Children's
Aid Society,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated from the treasury of the state of Maine to the Children's Aid Society of Maine for the purpose of aiding and enlarging its work at the girls' home located at Belfast, said sum to be expended under the direction of the executive committee of said society. Seven hundred fifty dollars of the above appropriation to be paid to the treasurer of said society in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, and seven hundred fifty in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-eight. Also that the further sum of five hundred dollars be appropriated from the treasury of the state of Maine for repairs on the buildings of girls' home located at Belfast, and held in trust for the state by the Children's Aid Society of Maine. Said sum to be expended under the direction of the executive committee of said society.

Chapter 231.

Resolve in favor of the town of Topsfield.

Resolved, That there be paid to the town of Topsfield the sum of twenty-one dollars and eighty-seven cents, out of the common school fund of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, on account of an error made in returning the number of scholars from that town for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

Chapter 232.

Resolves in aid of the Maine Gettysburg Commission.

Resolved, That the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars be and is hereby appropriated to be expended in completing the work of the Maine Gettysburg Commission. The bills for which when audited and approved by the governor and council, the state treasurer is directed to pay. The said sum is to be expended as follows; four hundred dollars for incidental
