Chapter 271.

An Act to amend Chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven entitled "An Act to prohibit the use of Oil Torches in the Herring Fishery."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1, chapter 42, public laws, 1887, amended. Section one of chapter forty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is hereby amended by striking out after the word "substance" in said section the words "in liquid form," so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Use of torches in herring fisheries prohibited between May 10 and December 1. 'Section 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from using in the herring fishery, in any of the waters of this state, torches in which kerosene oil, or any other inflammable substance enters as a component part thereof between the tenth day of May and first day of December.'

Chapter 272.

An Act to amend Section one hundred and four of Chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes, relating to duties of State Superintendent of Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 104, chapter 11, R, S., amended. Section I. Section one hundred and four of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter three hundred and seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eightynine, chapter two hundred and sixteen of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and chapter two hundred and seventy-three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following provision:

Shall perform all duties imposed by special laws of the state. 'Twelfth. The state superintendent shall perform all duties imposed upon him by any charter or charters granted by the legislature to educational institutions in the state.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
