Section 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 336.

An Act to close the tributaries of Upper and Lower Stone Ponds in the Town of Stoneham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Close time in tributaries of ponds in Stoneham established.

Penalty for violation.

Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries of Upper Stone pond and Lower Stone pond, in the town of Stoneham.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalties provided for illegal fishing in the general law of the state.

#### Chapter 337.

An Act to continue in force Chapter two hundred and seventy-six of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Van Buren Trust and Banking Company," as amended by Chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter extended for 2 years. Section I. Chapter two hundred and seventy-six of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Van Buren Trust and Banking Company," as amended by chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, is hereby continued in force, and the persons named in said act as amended, are hereby given a period of two years from the approval of this act in which to organize and commence business under said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
