Chapter 502.

An Act authorizing the construction of a wharf into the tide waters of the Penobscot river in Winterport, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Charles A. McKennev, his associates and assigns, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a wharf in front of his land, in the town of Winterport, Waldo county, and to extend the same into the tide waters of Penobscot river.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 22, 1901.

Chapter 503.

An Act to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government for the year nineteen hundred and one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In order to provide for the several acts and Expenditures Section 1. resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from of govern-ment for 1901. the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year of nineteen hundred and one, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.
