Chapter 20.

An Act to amend Section three, Chapter two hundred two, Public Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-nine entitled, "An Act to fix the salaries of the Judge and Register of Probate and County Commissioners of Waldo county."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section three, chapter two hundred two, public laws of eighteen hundred eighty-nine, is hereby amended by striking out section three and insert in the place thereof the following:

'Section 3. On and after the first day of February nineteen hundred and three, the pay of the county commissioners of Waldo county shall be two dollars and fifty cents per day for each day actually employed in the service of said county, including time spent in traveling, for which each commissioner shall have ten cents per mile for the distance actually traveled, but each commissioner shall have no more than one travel during the same hearing or session, or for more than two adjournments of any regular term or for services or travel on more than one petition or case at the same time, or anything for travel or attendance at the legislature, connected with the annual county estimates, or for any additional trouble or expense.'

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 21.

An Act to abolish Chapter five hundred and eighty-two, Public Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, relating to taking fish in Frenchman's Bay except by the ordinary process of fishing with hook and line.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sections one, two, three, four, five and six, chapter five hundred and eighty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight are hereby repealed.
