Chapter 33.

An Act to amend Section eighty-three of Chapter six of the Revised Statutes, relating to Tax Sales.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eighty-three of chapter six of the revised Section 83 of statutes is hereby amended by striking out from said section the chapter 6 of R. s., amended. following words: "but the purchaser or the county shall have a lien on the land sold or forfeited for taxes, costs and interests, and any subsequent taxes legally assessed thereon and paid by either, or those claiming under them; and such sums shall be paid or tendered, before any person shall commence, maintain or defend any suit at law or in equity, involving the title to such lands under such sale or forfeiture, notwithstanding any irregularities or omissions in such sale or forfeiture." Said amended section shall read as follows:

'Section 83. In any trial at law or in equity involving the County validity of any sale or forfeiture of such lands, as provided in the preceding section, it shall be prima facie proof of title for the party claiming under it, to produce in evidence the county treasurer's deed, duly executed and recorded, the assessments signed by the county commissioners and certified by them or their clerk to the county treasurer, and to prove that the county treasurer complied with the requirements of law in advertising and selling.

treasurer's deed, etc., shall be prima facie proof of title.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 34.

An Act to set apart an annual Old Home Week,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The week commencing with the second Sunday in August of Old home each year is hereby designated and set apart as Old Home Week; week, designated. and cities and towns are authorized to raise and appropriate money for the due observance thereof.
