Chapter 136.

An Act to repeal so much of Chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section five of Chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-nine, as prohibits fishing through the ice in Dexter pond, in Dexter, Penobscot county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. So much of chapter thirty, of the revised statutes, as amended by section five of chapter forty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred ninety-nine, as prohibits fishing through the ice in Dexter pond, in Dexter, Penobscot county, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 24, 1903.

Fishing through the ice in Dexter pond, prohibition removed.

Chapter 137.

An Act to amend Chapter three, Section fifty-nine, Paragraph twelve of the Revised Statutes, relating to dealers in Old Junk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter three, section fifty-nine, paragraph twelve of the revised statutes relating to dealers in old junk is hereby amended by inserting in the second line of said section the words 'and dealers in second hand articles and the pawning of articles with pawnbrokers,' and in the third line of said section the words, 'pawners and pawnbrokers' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 59. Cities may establish ordinances regulating the purchase and sale of articles usually bought by old junk dealers and dealers in second hand articles, and the pawning of articles with pawnbrokers, and may therein prescribe conditions to be observed by buyers and sellers, pawners and pawnbrokers, to prevent or detect the sale or purchase of stolen goods; and suitable penalties may be prescribed in such ordinances.'

Cities may prescribe conditions to be observed by pawn brokers, old junk dealers, etc.
