Chapter 162.

An Act to repeal so much of Chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section five of Chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and as amended by Chapter three hundred seventy-nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and one, as prohibits fishing through the ice in Big Carry pond, or West Carry pond, so called, in Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing through ice in Big Carry pond, or West Carry pond, prohibition repealed.

Section 1. So much of chapter thirty of the revised statutes, as amended by section five of chapter forty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and as amended by chapter three hundred seventy-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, as prohibits fishing through the ice in Big Carry pond, or West Carry pond, so called, in Somerset county, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 163.

An Act to repeal so much of Chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section five of Chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and as amended by Chapter three hundred twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and one, as prohibits ice fishing in Black, Whittier and Perry ponds, in the towns of Vienna and Chesterville, in Kennebec and Franklin Counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing through ice in Black, Whittier and Perry ponds, prohibition repealed.

Section 1. So much of chapter thirty of the revised statutes, as amended by section five of chapter forty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and as amended by chapter three hundred twenty-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, as prohibits fishing through the ice in Black, Whittier and Perry ponds, in the towns of Vienna and Chesterville, in Kennebec and Franklin counties, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
