Chapter 206.

An Act relating to the salary of the County Attorney of Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary of
county
attorney of
Somerset
county, fixed.

From and after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, the salary of the county attorney for the county of Somerset shall be seven hundred dollars a year.

Approved March 28, 1903.

Chapter 207.

An Act to increase the salary of the County Attorney of Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary of
county
attorney of
Piscataquis
county, fixed.

Section 1. From and after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, the salary of the county attorney for the county of Piscataquis shall be six hundred dollars a year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 28, 1903.

Chapter 208.

An Act relating to the Salary of the Register of Probate of Sagadahoc County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary of
register of
probate,
Sagadahoc
county, fixed.

Section 1. On and after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and three, the salary of the register of probate of the county of Sagadahoc shall be seven hundred dollars a year instead of the sum now fixed by law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
