Chapter 209.

An Act to amend Section ten of Chapter sixty of the Revised Statutes, relating to Divorce.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section ten of chapter sixty of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all the words in said section and substituting therefor the following:

Section 10 of chapter 60, R. S., amended.

'Section 10. When a divorce is decreed to the husband for the fault of the wife, he shall be entitled to one-third, in common and undivided of all her real estate, except wild lands, which shall descend to him as if she were dead; and the court may allow him so much of her personal estate as seems reasonable. In all cases the right, title and interest of the libellee in the real estate of the libellant shall be barred by the decree.'

Provisions for husband in case of divorce for fault of wife.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 210.

An Act in relation to the Salary of the County Attorney of the County of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. On and after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, the salary of the county attorney of Hancock county shall be seven hundred and fifty dollars per annum, instead of the sum now established by law.

Salary, county attorney, Hancock county, fixed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
