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CHAP. 5

contracts, obligations and liabilities of said Old Orchard Electric Light Company upon such terms as said companies may mutually determine.

—York Light and Heat Company may assume liabilities of. York Light and Heat Company may purchase property of.

Section 2. The York Light and Heat Company is hereby authorized to purchase, hold, own and enjoy the franchises, property, shares of stock, rights, easements, privileges and immunities of the said Old Orchard Electric Light Company. And the said Old Orchard Electric Light Company is hereby authorized to sell, transfer and convey its franchises, property, shares of stock, rights, easements, privileges and immunities to the said York Light and Heat Company, upon such terms as said companies may determine.

—Old Orchard Electric Light Company may sell.

And any past sale of said franchises, property, shares of stock, rights, easements, privileges and immunities is hereby confirmed and declared legal and valid.

—past sale declared legal.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 5.**

An Act to amend Sections one and four of Chapter three hundred and thirty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and one, being "An Act to incorporate the Winthrop Cold Spring Water Company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one of said chapter three hundred and thirty-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking out the words "N. M. Carleton" in the first line of said section and inserting instead thereof the following names: 'Joseph Fortier, Lizzie Kelley, L. C. Lee, W. A. Whiting, and W. E. Berry,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1, chapter 339, laws 1901, amended.

'Section 1. L. T. Carleton, C. H. Gale, Joseph Fortier, Lizzie Kelley, L. C. Lee, W. A. Whiting, W. E. Berry, Charles P. Hannaford, and Adam Fortier of Winthrop in the county of Kennebec, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a corporation under the name of the Winthrop Cold Spring Water Company, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of the town of Winthrop with pure water for domestic purposes, with all the rights and privileges and subject to all the liabilities and obligations of similar corporations under the laws of this state.'

Section 2. Section four of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out the words "shall be one hundred and twenty-five"

'Section 4. The capital stock of the said corporation shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars, and the stock shall be divided into shares of fifty dollars each.'

### Chapter 6.

An Act authorizing the State Treasurer to purchase unmatured State of Maine bonds.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

treasurer may  
purchase and  
cancel out-  
standing and  
unmatured  
bonds of the  
state.

Section 1. Whenever, from time to time, in the judgment of the treasurer of state, it may be done to the financial advantage of the state, said treasurer of state, with the advice and consent of the governor and council, shall have the right and authority to purchase, with any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, and when so purchased to cancel, any of the outstanding, unmatured bonds of the state.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 7.

An Act to amend Chapter sixty-one of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, entitled "An Act to establish the Bar Harbor Municipal Court."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1,  
chapter 61,  
laws 1899,  
amended.

Section 1. Section one of chapter sixty-one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows:

Bar Harbor  
municipal  
court  
established.

'Section 1. A municipal court is hereby established in the town of Eden, which shall be called the Bar Harbor Municipal Court, and shall be a court of record with a seal. All original processes, issuing from said court, shall be under the teste of the judge, and signed by the judge, or recorder, and shall have the seal of said court affixed.'
