Chapter 9.

An Act to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government for the year nineteen hundred and three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Act of appropriation for 1903.

Section I. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year of nineteen hundred and three, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.

Chapter 10.

An Act in relation to the powers of the Union River Light, Gas and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Organization of Union River Light, Gas and Power Company ratified, approved and confirmed.

--except in certain towns.

May issue bonds.

-amount of bonds limited.

-bonds may be secured by mortgage. Section 1. The organization of the Union River Light, Gas and Power Company, a corporation organized at Ellsworth, Hancock county, Maine, under the general laws of said state of Maine, for the purposes set forth in its certificate of organization approved by the attorney general of said state of Maine, October six, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and two, and the right of said company to carry out such purposes, except in the towns of Mount Desert and Tremont, are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 2. Said company is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds for the carrying out of any of its purposes as named in said certificate of organization and in this act prescribed, except in the towns of Mount Desert and Tremont, to an amount not exceeding the sum of one million dollars, on such rates and time as it may deem expedient, and to secure the payment of the principal and interest on such bonds by appropriate mortgages or deeds of trust of all or any part of its property, franchises, rights and privileges now owned, or to be hereafter acquired by it.
