CHAP. 30

—may mortgage its franchises and property. Certain towns may hold stock in the corporation.

scribed for, in aid of the purposes specified in this act, and to secure the same by a mortgage of its franchises and property.

Section 7. The towns of Newport, Plymouth, Detroit or Palmyra or any manufacturing or machine company having a place of business in said towns, may take and hold stock in said corporation, and contract with said corporation for gas or electricity for light or power.

Section 8. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 30.

An Act to extend the charter of the Camden Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Camden Trust Company, rights, powers and privileges extended.

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Camden Trust Company, which were granted by chapter four hundred and three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 31.

An Act to extend the charter of the Cumberland Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Cumberland Trust Company, rights, powers and privileges extended.

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Cumberland Trust Company which were granted by chapter three hundred and sixty-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
