Chapter 63.

An Act to amend Chapter two hundred seventy-one of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred one, relating to the Lincoln Electric Railway Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter amended.

Section 1. Section eleven of chapter two hundred seventy-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred one is hereby amended by striking out the word "two," in the third line, and inserting in place thereof, the word 'four,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Shall be void unless operations are commenced within four years.

'Section 11. This charter shall be null and void unless operations for building this railroad shall have been actually commenced without four years from date of the passage of this act.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 64.

An Act to legalize the doings of the Crosbyville Chapel, at Bangor, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Acts and doings legalized.

Section 1. All acts and doings of the Crosbyville Chapel, Bangor, Maine, from the date of incorporation to the present date are hereby legalized.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 65.

An Act in relation to the election of the Members of the School Committee of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

School committee, shall be elected.

Section 1. The members of the school committee of the city of Portland, including the female members of said committee, shall hereafter continue to be elected on the first Monday in December at the annual municipal election and in the same manner now provided for by law, except that a plurality of the votes given at such election shall determine the choice of members of said committee.

—time fixed.

—plurality shall determine the choice of members.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
