Chapter 94.

An Act to prevent the pollution of the waters of Sebago Lake.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Restrictions on building on shores or islands of Sebago lake.

Section 1. No person or corporation shall use or occupy any structure hereafter built upon or near the shores of Sebago lake in the county of Cumberland, or upon any of the islands of said lake, for such purposes or in such manner that the sewage or drainage therefrom shall enter the waters of said lake or pollute the same.

Sewage, etc., shall not be discharged into said lake.

Section 2. No sewage, drainage, refuse or polluting matter of such kind and amount as either by itself or in connection with other matter will corrupt or impair the quality of the water of said Sebago lake, or render it injurious to health, shall be discharged into said lake, but nothing herein shall prohibit the cultivation and use of the soil in the ordinary methods of agriculture if no human excrement is used thereon within three hundred feet of the shores of said lake.

Supreme judicial court shall have power to enjoin.

Section 3. The supreme judicial court shall have jurisdiction in equity to enjoin, prevent or restrain any violation of the provisions of this act.

Section 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 95.

An Act to amend an act incorporating the Trustees of Coburn Classical Institute.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 333 of private and special laws of 1901, amended.

Section 1. Section two of chapter three hundred thirty-three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, is hereby amended by striking out of the second line thereof the word "seventeen" and inserting in its place the word 'twenty', so that said section two, as amended, shall read:

Board of trustees not exceeding twenty shall be elected.

'Section 2. Said corporation shall be governed and its powers exercised by a board of not exceeding twenty trustees, of which the president of Colby College and the principal of Coburn Classical Institute for the time being shall, ex-officio, be members. At the organization of the corporation, the number of other trustees shall be fixed by the by-laws and shall be divided as
