Chapter 96.

An Act to extend the charter of the Wilton Electric Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That the rights, powers and privileges of the Wilton Electric Light and Power Company which were granted by chapter three hundred and twenty-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby renewed and extended for and during a term of two years from the date of the approval of this act and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as provided therein.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 97.

An Act authorizing the City of Rockland to accept donations of money and property to establish and maintain a Free Public Library in Rockland, and to accept conveyances of land for a site therefor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The city of Rockland is hereby authorized to receive and accept donations and bequests of money and property to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a free public library in said Rockland, and of erecting a suitable building therefor, and also to accept conveyances of land for a site for said building, which shall be forever held by said city for the

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purpose aforesaid. And all acts and votes of said city, or of the city council, for the establishment and maintenance of a free public library in said city are hereby ratified and confirmed, and made valid.

Trustees.

Section 2. The management and control of said library, and of the buildings and grounds connected therewith, shall be vested in a board of trustees, to be designated "Trustees of the Rockland Public Library," consisting of the mayor, who shall be, ex officio, a member thereof, and of such a number of other trustees, inhabitants of the city of Rockland, as the city council may determine upon, to be elected by ballot in joint convention, all of whom shall serve as trustees without compensation.

Section 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 98.

An Act to amend the charter of the Northport Wesleyan Grove Campmeeting Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter 319 of special laws of 1873, as amended by chapter 458 of special laws of 1891, further amended.

Section 1. Chapter three hundred and nineteen of the private and special laws of the state of Maine, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-three, being "An Act to incorporate the Northport Wesleyan Grove Campmeeting Association," as amended by chapter four hundred and fifty-eight of the private and special laws of the state of Maine, for the year nineteen hundred and one, is hereby further amended by adding after the word "same" in the twentieth line of section one, the following words, 'and to erect and maintain fences on all lines bounding the lands of the association, with gates at public entrances, with full power to control the same'; and to add to said section after the word "state" in the twenty-seventh line, the following words, 'and the association is authorized to appoint a health officer whose jurisdiction shall be within the bounds of the lands of the said association in the town of Northport, who shall have authority to act, and be subject to the same restrictions, as is provided by statute with reference to local health officers'; so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:
