Chapter 100.

An Act to amend Chapter six hundred and thirteen of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An Act to establish the Western Hancock Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section nine of chapter six hundred and thirteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three is hereby amended by striking out the words "on the fourth Tuesday of each of the months of May, July, September and November in the town of Deer Isle" and inserting in place thereof the words 'on the fourth Tuesday of each of the months of January, February, March, April, May, July, September, October, November and December in the town of Deer Isle,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 9 of chapter 613 of special laws of 1893, amended.

'Section 9. A term of said court shall be held for the transaction of civil business as follows: On the second Tuesday of each of the months of January, March, July and September in the town of Bluehill. On the second Tuesday of each of the months of February, May, June, August, November and December in the town of Bucksport. On the fourth Tuesday of each of the months of January, February, March, April, May, July, September, October, November and December in the town of Deer Isle. On the fourth Tuesday of the months of June and August in the town of Castine. Beginning at ten o'clock in the forenoon at such place in either of the towns named in this section, as the judge shall determine. For the cognizance and trial of criminal actions said court shall be considered in constant session. In all cases it may be adjourned from time to time by the judge.'

When terms of court shall be held.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
