May issue bonds.

May operate branches. increase its capital stock to any amount not exceeding one million dollars.

Section 3. Said corporation, the Hancock County Railway Company, is hereby authorized and permitted to issue its bonds for the construction of its works, maintenance or operation of the same, of any or all kinds, upon such rates and time as it may deem expedient, not however exceeding in total amount the amount of one million dollars, and to secure the payment of the principal and interest on such bonds by appropriate mortgages or deeds of trust of all or any part of its property, franchises, rights and privileges now owned or to be hereafter acquired by it. Section 4. Said corporation, the Hancock County Railway Company is hereby granted the further right to build, equip, maintain and operate a branch or branches of its line in all or any of the towns of Ellsworth, Surry, Bluehill, Brooklin, Sedgwick, Brooksville, Castine or Penobscot, in said county of Hancock, with like privileges respectively in each of said towns, and subject to like restrictions respectively in each of said towns as provided by said chapter three hundred one of the laws of nineteen hundred one for the construction of its main line.

Section 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 107.

An Act to repeal the provisions of Section three of Chapter five hundred forty-four of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-nine, relating to the Bangor Street Railway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The provisions of section three of chapter five hundred and forty-four of the special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-nine are hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
