CHAP. 125

Chapter 125.

An Act amendatory to Section six of Chapter four hundred and ninety-five of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An Act to incorporate the People's Ferry Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 6 of chapter 495 of special laws of 1885, amended.

Time for running boats, designated.

Section six of chapter four hundred and ninety-five of the special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five is hereby amended so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 6. The time for running said boat or boats, unless prevented by accident or unavoidable casualty shall on week days be not later than six o'clock in the forenoon and not less than two round trips per hour shall be run up to and until six and one-half o'clock in the afternoon, and on Sundays the time for running shall be not later than eight o'clock in the forenoon and not less than two round trips per hour shall be run up to and until six o'clock in the afternoon.

—may run other trips.

And the said People's Ferry Company is hereby given the further power and authority to run as many other trips before, after and during the above mentioned hours as it may deem for its best interests in addition to those required, using for these trip or trips a boat or boats for teams, freight and passengers or a boat or boats for passengers and freight only as the said company may deem expedient.'

This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 126.

An Act to amend the charter of the Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Locations of rails, posts wires and fixtures made valid.

Section 1. The locations of the rails, posts, wires and fixtures of the Lewiston and Auburn Horse Railroad Company, the Bath Street Railway and of the Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway in the streets, roads and ways of Auburn, Lewiston, Webster, Lisbon, Topsham, Brunswick, West Bath and Bath are hereby confirmed and made valid. This section shall apply only to locations heretofore legally and finally approved.

—exception.

May sell or lease its property to connecting lines.

Section 2. The said Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway is hereby authorized to sell or lease its property and franchises to any street railroad company whose lines as con-

structed or chartered would form connecting or continuous lines with the lines of the said Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway as constructed or chartered, and in such case the corporation so purchasing or leasing said property and franchises shall be entitled to all the privileges and be subject to all appropriate conditions and limitations contained in the charter and franchises of the said Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway. Any street railroad whose lines as constructed or chartered would form connecting or continuous lines with the lines of the said Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway as constructed or chartered is hereby authorized to so purchase or lease the property and franchises of the said Lewiston, Brunswick and Bath Street Railway.

—connecting lines authorized to purchase or lease.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 127.

An Act to increase the capital stock of the Ticonic Foot Bridge Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section five of chapter thirty-seven of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine is hereby amended by striking out the word "twenty-five" in the second line and inserting instead thereof the word 'forty' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 5 of chapter 37 of special laws of 1899, amended.

'Section 5. Said corporation may issue stock to an amount not exceeding forty thousand dollars and may issue bonds not exceeding the amount of stock issued.'

Amount of capital stock.
—bonds.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
