Chapter 232.

An Act authorizing the town of Anson to purchase with the town of Madison in the county of Somerset, the Norridgewock Falls Bridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Anson, town of, authorized to raise money to purchase bridge.

Section 1. The town of Anson in the county of Somerset is hereby authorized and empowered to raise money by taxation or by temporary loan or loans, to be paid out of money raised by taxation during the year in which they are made; to purchase with the town of Madison the bridge across the Kennebec river between the said towns of Anson and Madison, erected by and belonging to the proprietors of Norridgewock Falls Bridge.

Authorized to purchase bridge, with town of Madison.

Section 2. Said town of Anson is hereby authorized and empowered to take and purchase with the said town of Madison said bridge and franchise, with all the rights, powers, privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, on the payment to said proprietors of said bridge such sum therefor as may be mutually agreed upon by said towns and said proprietors; each town to pay such part of such sum, or purchase price, as they shall mutually agree upon; provided, that after such purchase said bridge shall be declared free for public travel and use.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 233.

An Act to amend the charter of Dead River Log Driving Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 7 of chapter 279, private and special laws of 1880, amended.

Section 1. Section seven of chapter two hundred and seventy-nine of private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty is hereby amended as follows, namely; by striking out the word "Wednesday" in the fourth line thereof and inserting in its place the word "Tuesday," so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Day of holding annual meeting, changed.

'Section 7. The first meeting of said company may be called by any one of the corporators named in this act, by written notice to each member. Annual meetings shall be called by the clerk, on the third Tuesday of February in each year, or at such times as the company may vote, by giving fourteen days' notice, in some newspaper published in Kennebec or Somerset counties;
