Section 2. Section two of said chapter two hundred and seventy-nine of private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty is hereby amended by striking out the word "five" in the second line of said section and inserting in its place the word 'seven,' so that said section shall read as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 279, laws of 1880, amended.

'Section 2. The officers of said company shall be a clerk, treasurer and board of seven directors, all of whom shall be chosen by ballot and sworn, and a master driver and such other officers and agents as may be deemed necessary, may be appointed by the directors unless chosen at the annual meeting. The directors shall, at the first meeting, elect one of their number, who shall be president of the company. A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for doing business. The treasurer shall give bonds to the acceptance of the directors.'

Number of directors increased.

Chapter 234.

An Act to authorize the Augusta Trust Company to increase its capital stock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The Augusta Trust Company is hereby authorized to increase its capital stock from time to time to an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 235.

An Act to incorporate the Mount Abram Cemetery Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Eben E. Rand, Llewellyn P. Bryant, O. P. Farrington, Walter B. Rand, Charles E. Stowell, Harry M. Swift, their associates, successors and assigns and such other persons as are owners of lots in the cemetery situated at Locke's Mills, in the town of Greenwood, in the county of Oxford, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Mount Abram Cemetery Company.
