Section 2. Section two of said chapter two hundred and seventy-nine of private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty is hereby amended by striking out the word "five" in the second line of said section and inserting in its place the word 'seven,' so that said section shall read as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 279, laws of 1880, amended.

'Section 2. The officers of said company shall be a clerk, treasurer and board of seven directors, all of whom shall be chosen by ballot and sworn, and a master driver and such other officers and agents as may be deemed necessary, may be appointed by the directors unless chosen at the annual meeting. The directors shall, at the first meeting, elect one of their number, who shall be president of the company. A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for doing business. The treasurer shall give bonds to the acceptance of the directors.'

Number of directors increased.

Chapter 234.

An Act to authorize the Augusta Trust Company to increase its capital stock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The Augusta Trust Company is hereby authorized to increase its capital stock from time to time to an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars.

Authorized to increase capital stock.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 235.

An Act to incorporate the Mount Abram Cemetery Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Eben E. Rand, Llewellyn P. Bryant, O. P. Farrington, Walter B. Rand, Charles E. Stowell, Harry M. Swift, their associates, successors and assigns and such other persons as are owners of lots in the cemetery situated at Locke's Mills, in the town of Greenwood, in the county of Oxford, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Mount Abram Cemetery Company.

Corporators.

CHAP. 236

May purchase land to the value of \$5,000.

Section 2. The corporation hereby created may purchase and hold such land as may be necessary for the present or future requirements of said corporation not to exceed five thousand dollars and may hold such personal property as may be needed or appropriate to the purposes of this corporation and may convey lots for burial purposes by their corporate deeds, but nothing in this section shall limit the right to take land by petition to the municipal officers of the town in accordance with chapter fifteen of the revised statutes.

May have corporate seal.

Section 3. Said corporation may have a corporate seal to be used in its conveyances and may make and establish such by-laws for the government of its concerns as may be necessary, not conflicting with the laws of the state.

Board of directors.

Section 4. Said corporation by its board of directors shall have the care, control and general management of the cemetery.

Owners of lots shall be members of corporation.

Section 5. All persons who are or shall be owners of lots in said cemetery shall be members of this corporation and each member shall be entitled to one ballot.

Officers.

Section 6. The officers of this corporation shall be a president, secretary, treasurer and a board of directors of not less than five, who shall hold their offices until others are chosen.

-tenure.

First meeting.

Section 7. Either of the corporators is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of the corporation by posting notices thereof in three public places in the vicinity, seven days before said meeting.

Section 8. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 236.

An Act to extend the time for the acceptance of the charter of the City of Dexter.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Time extended for acceptance of charter.

The time within which the charter of the city of Dexter, granted by chapter seventeen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Dexter," approved February seventh, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, may be submitted for acceptance to the legal voters of the town of Dexter as provided in section twenty-four of said act, is hereby extended to February seventh, nineteen hundred and eight.
