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**Chapter 273.**

An Act authorizing the town of Fort Fairfield to make a loan.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The inhabitants of the town of Fort Fairfield are hereby authorized to procure by loan on the faith and credit of the town, a sum of money not exceeding thirty thousand dollars, for the purpose of erecting, equipping and furnishing a school building; and they may issue bonds therefor on such terms and conditions as the town shall vote.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 274.**

An Act to amend and extend the charter of the Waldo Trust Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section two of chapter five hundred of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking therefrom the words "either at Frankfort or Winterport" and inserting instead thereof the word 'Belfast,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 2. The corporation hereby created shall be located at Belfast, Waldo county, Maine.'

Location.

Section 2. The time within which the Waldo Trust Company must organize and commence business under its charter as hereby amended is hereby extended until two years from the date of the approval of this act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
