Chapter 278.

An Act to amend the charter of the "Moose River Log Driving Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter one hundred seventy-nine of private and special laws of eighteen hundred seventy-nine, is hereby amended as follows: By striking out, in the thirteenth and fourteenth lines, the words "Moose River bridge," and inserting in their place the words 'head of Attian pond and of Wood pond,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1,

'Section 1. That Elias Milliken, Joseph S. Bradstreet, Franklin Smith, C. B. Foster and Abner Coburn, their associates and successors be and they are hereby made a body politic and corporate by the name and style of Moose River Log Driving Company, and by that name may sue and be sued, prosecute and defend to final judgment and execution, both in law and in equity, and may make and adopt any and all regulations and by-laws not repugnant to the constitution and laws of the state, and may adopt a common seal, may hold real and personal estate, sufficient to carry on successfully the business of the Moose River Log Driving Company, and may grant and vote money for the same. And said company shall drive all logs and other timber coming into Moose river, between the head of Attian pond and of Wood pond and Moosehead lake for the purpose of being driven to market. And said company may for the purposes aforesaid remove obstructions, erect booms and dams, where the same may be lawfully done, and may use steam or other power for the purpose of towing logs and booms, and shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the liabilities, incident to corporations of a similar nature.'

Section 2. Section seven of said act is amended by striking out the word "Wednesday" in the fourth line thereof, and inserting in its place the word 'Tuesday,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 7,

'Section 7. The first meeting of said company may be called by any one of the corporators named in this act, by written notice to each member. Annual meetings shall be called by the clerk on the third Tuesday of February in each year, or at such times as the company may vote, by giving fourteen days' notice in some newspaper published in Kennebec or Somerset county; special meetings may be called by order of the directors, with like notice.'
