CHAP. 302**Chapter 302.**

An Act creating a close time on the tributaries to Indian, South and Twitchell ponds, and on Indian pond, in Greenwood, and the tributaries to Bryant pond in Woodstock, in the county of Oxford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Close time  
for fishing in  
certain  
waters in  
Oxford  
county.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time, to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in any of the tributaries to Indian pond, South pond and Twitchell pond, situated in the town of Greenwood, or the tributaries to Bryant pond in the town of Woodstock.

Indian pond.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in Indian pond, above named, for three years from April first, nineteen hundred and three.

Penalty for  
violation.

Section 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law for illegal fishing.

**Chapter 303.**

An Act to legalize the doings of the selectmen of the town of Waltham.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Doings of  
selectmen of  
Waltham  
made valid.

Section 1. The doings of the selectmen of the town of Waltham in the county of Hancock for the year nineteen hundred, whereby the board of selectmen acted as fire wardens and assessed taxes to pay expense of same are hereby made legal and valid.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
