Chapter 317.

An Act to prohibit the taking of Clams in the shores or flats within the Town of Scarborough.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take or dig or destroy in any manner clams in any of the shores or flats within the town of Scarborough from the first day of April until the first day of October in each year under a penalty of not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars for each and every violation of this statute.

Section 2. The aforesaid section shall not apply to inhabitants or residents of said town taking clams for the consumption of himself and family nor to hotel keepers within the town taking clams for the use of their hotels.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 318.

An Act to prohibit the sale of any kind of fish, except eels, taken from certain ponds in Kennebec and Somerset counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, or offer for sale, any kind of fish, except eels, at any time, taken from any of the following named lakes and ponds and their tributaries lying wholly or in part in the counties of Kennebec and Somerset, to wit: East, North, Little, Great, Long, McGraw, Ellis and Snow ponds, under a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and a further fine of one dollar for each fish sold in violation of this law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect May first, nineteen hundred three.
