Chapter 330.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter five hundred and sixteen of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act additional relating to the appointment of a Recorder for the Bath Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter five hundred and sixteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven is hereby amended by striking out the words "When the office of judge is vacant, the recorder shall be entitled to the fees; in all other cases he shall be paid by the judge," in the eleventh, twelfth and thirteenth lines of said section; and inserting instead the words "The said recorder shall receive a salary of seventy-five dollars per annum, which shall be in full for all services performed by him, and which shall be paid him in the same manner as the salary of the judge of said court is now provided to be paid," so that said section, as hereby amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. There shall be appointed by the governor, for said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said court when requested so to do by the judge; and in case of the absence of the judge from the court room, or when the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall have and exercise all the powers of the judge and perform all the duties required of said judge, and shall be empowered to sign and issue all processes and papers, and to do all acts as fully and with the same effect as the judge could do were he acting in the premises, and the signature of the recorder as such, shall be sufficient evidence of his right to act instead of the judge. The said recorder shall receive a salary of seventy-five dollars per annum, which shall be in full for all services performed by him, and which shall be paid him in the same manner as the salary of the judge of said court is now provided to be paid. Said recorder shall reside in Bath, and shall hold his office until another is appointed in his stead.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
