Chapter 352.

An Act to legalize the acts and doings of Nashville Plantation, Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Acts of Nashville plantation, legalized. Section 1. All acts and doings of Nashville plantation, Aroostook county, Maine, prior to this date are hereby legalized and made valid.

May raise money for repair of winter roads. Section 2. Said plantation may raise money at any annual meeting for the breaking, opening and repairing of snow roads, and to keep its winter roads passable for public travel, to be expended by the assessors of said plantation.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 353.

An Act relating to the new iron bridge over the Presumpscot River in the Town of Falmouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

County of Cumberland may acquire bridge over Presumpscot river.

-rights and liabilities of county, in respect to. Section I. When the town of Falmouth, in the county of Cumberland, shall release to said county by deed all the rights of said town in and to the new iron bridge over the Presumpscot river, on the new Gray road in said Falmouth, and shall cause said deed to be recorded in the Cumberland registry of deeds, the said county shall thereupon be vested with all the rights and powers, and be subject to all the obligations and liabilities of said town, in respect to said bridge; and the county commissioners of said county shall thereafter, at the expense of said county, inspect, repair and maintain, said bridge, and, when necessary, rebuild the same. Said town of Falmouth is hereby authorized to convey its rights in said bridge as aforesaid.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
