Chapter 382.

An Act relative to elections of Treasurer and Collector of Taxes of the City of Hallowell.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Treasurer and collector.

Section 1. The treasurer and collector of taxes of the city of Hallowell may be one and the same person.

Election of Charles K. Howe, made legal.

Section 2. The election on March nine, nineteen hundred and three, of Charles K. Howe as treasurer and collector of taxes of the city of Hallowell, is hereby made legal and valid.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 383.

An Act authorizing the acceptance of the conveyance of Widow's Island, Maine, by the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Widow's island accepted for public purposes.

That, pursuant to an act of Congress approved March two, nineteen hundred and three, the state of Maine hereby accepts, to be used for public purposes, Widow's island situated in Fox island thoroughfare on the coast of Maine, with all of the buildings and improvements thereon, subject to all of the terms and conditions of said act of Congress; and that the governor of the state of Maine, be and is hereby, authorized and instructed to procure and receive the conveyance thereof to the state of Maine; and to take such action as may be necessary to properly care for and protect the same until it may be used for some public purpose by the state of Maine.
