vessels through the bridge during said hours. And such draw-tender, or his assistant, shall be in attendance to open and close such bridge for the passage of any boat at such additional time and hour as may be necessary, upon the request of any captain, agent or owner of said boat.

Section 3. Said bridge shall at all times be so opened and closed as not to unnecessarily hinder or obstruct navigation through, nor travel over it.

Opening and closing shall not obstruct travel or navigation.

Section 4. Said municipal officers shall annually appoint a competent assistant to tend said bridge when the regular tender is unavoidably absent.

Keepers' assistant.

Section 5. No person, unless the duly appointed draw-tender or keeper or his qualified assistant, shall be allowed to open such bridge at any time, under a penalty of ten dollars for each offense, the same to be collected in an action of debt, in any competent court of jurisdiction.

Unauthorized persons shall not open draw.

Section 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 422.

An Act in relation to the salary of the Recorder of the Municipal Court of the City of Biddeford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter twenty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine is hereby amended as follows, namely: by striking out section two and inserting instead thereof the following:

Chapter 24, private and special laws of 1899, amended.

'Section 2. For all services rendered, except when there is a vacancy in the office of judge, the recorder shall be paid from the county treasury the sum of three hundred dollars annually, payable on the first days of January, April, July and October, which shall be in full of all services rendered as such recorder.'
