Chapter 9.

Resolves providing for the preservation of Regimental Rolls in the Adjutant-General's office.

Resolved, That the adjutant-general is hereby authorized and directed under the advice and control of the governor and council to provide for the preservation of the enlistment, descriptive and muster rolls, and the monthly returns of the regiments and batteries in the war of the rebellion, now on file in the adjutant-general's office.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and three, and two thousand four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and four, is hereby appropriated for the preservation of said rolls.

Chapter 10.

Resolve for State Pensions.

Resolved, That the sum of eighty-five thousand dollars be and is hereby appropriated to provide for state pensions for invalid soldiers and sailors, their widows and orphans, and the dependent children, parents and sisters of deceased soldiers and sailors eligible thereto under existing law, for the year nineteen hundred and three, and eighty-five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and four.

Chapter 11.

Resolve in favor of Mary C. Rankin, widow of Orlenzo K. Rankin, late of Company K, First New England Regiment, Mexican War.

Resolved, That a pension be allowed Mary C. Rankin of Liberty, of eight dollars per month, from the first day of January nineteen hundred and three.
