Resolve in favor of the Society of the Sisters of Charity for the use of the Healy Asylum of Lewiston, Maine.

Resolved, That the sum of four thousand dollars be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to the Society of the Sisters of Charity for the use of the Healy asylum in Lewiston, of which two thousand dollars shall be paid during the year nineteen hundred and three and two thousand dollars during the year nineteen hundred and four.
