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**Chapter 50.**

Resolve in favor of the Maine Home for Friendless Boys.

*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropriated twenty-five hundred dollars for the use of the Maine Home for Friendless Boys at Portland, as follows: one thousand two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and three, and one thousand two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and four.

**Chapter 51.**

Resolve in favor of George B. Haskell, Jacob R. Little and Stephen J. Kelley, in payment of witnesses', magistrates' and officers' fees and disbursements made by them in the city of Lewiston contested election case.

*Resolved,* That the sum of six hundred dollars and twenty-eight cents is hereby appropriated, and that the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay said sum of six hundred dollars and twenty-eight cents to George B. Haskell, Jacob R. Little and Stephen J. Kelley, the sitting members, for witnesses', magistrates' and officers' fees and disbursements made by them in contesting their seats in the house of representatives, in the contested election case of the city of Lewiston.
