Chapter 62.

Resolve in favor of the Bangor Children's Home.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars per annum for the years nineteen hundred and three and nineteen hundred and four be and hereby is appropriated in aid of the current expenses of the Bangor Children's Home.

Chapter 63.

Resolve in favor of Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the completion of a new church at Pleasant Point, in the Town of Perry.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of completing of the new church at Pleasant Point in the town of Perry. Said money to be paid from the fund, belonging to the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, now in the state treasury. Said fund being the money received by the state for stumpage and for land sold belonging to said tribe, and that said sum be expended under the direction of the governor and council.

Chapter 64.

Resolve in favor of rebuilding the house of the Sisters of Mercy at Peter Dana's Point, within the jurisdiction of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of rebuilding the house occupied by the Sisters of Mercy at Peter Dana's Point, within the jurisdiction of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, said money to be paid from the fund belonging to the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, now in the state treasury, said fund being the money received by the state from stumpage and for land sold belonging to said tribe, and that said sum be expended under the direction of the governor and council.
