CHAP. 122**Chapter 122.**

Resolve in favor of the town of New Sharon.

New Sharon,
town of, in
favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and three, for the purpose of assisting to repair the highway bridge across the Sandy river in the town of New Sharon, and that the same be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin county. Said amount to be paid upon certificate of said commissioners to the governor and council that the repairs on said bridge have been completed at a cost of not less than three thousand dollars.

Chapter 123.

Resolve in favor of C. C. Libby, Chairman of the Committee on Education.

C. C. Libby,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of four hundred and ten dollars be paid from the state treasury to C. C. Libby to defray the expenses of committee on education and such members of the senate and house as joined, from Augusta to the University of Maine at Orono and return.

Chapter 124.

Resolve in favor of George D. Gaddis of East Machias.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars is hereby appropriated, to be paid to George D. Gaddis of East Machias; the same being in full for services in taking care of state military property from December eighteen hundred and seventy-four to June in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and two.
