Resolve in favor of the State Committee of the Young Men's Christian Association of Maine.

*Resolved,* That the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars be and is hereby appropriated to pay Lewy Mitchell, representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, for his travel and attendance at this session of the legislature.

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**Chapter 132.**

Resolve in favor of the Town of Jackson.

*Resolved,* That there be paid to the town of Jackson the sum of seventy-nine dollars and sixty cents, to reimburse the town for its loss of state school fund to that amount, on account of an error in the enumeration of persons between the ages of four and twenty-one on April one, nineteen hundred and one.
