### Chapter 192.

An Act to extend the powers of the Trustees of Bangor Theological Seminary.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

May confer degrees in divinity.

Section I. The trustees of Bangor Theological Seminary are hereby authorized and empowered to confer degrees in divinity upon such of its graduates, and upon such other persons, as may be determined by said trustees to be suitable candidates for such degrees.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 15, 1905.

### Chapter 193.

An Act to extend the charter of the Patten Telegraph and Telephona Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter extended. Section 1. The charter of the Patten Telegraph and Telephone Company is hereby extended two years.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 15, 1905.

### Chapter 194.

An Act to incorporate the Harmony and Wellington Telephone Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

--corporate

name.

May maintain lines of telephone.

--limitation of lines. Section I. John S. Hight, A. H. Willis and Everett Reed, and their associates, successors, assigns, are hereby created a body politic by the name of the Harmony and Wellington Telephone Company, with all the rights, powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and obligations of similar corporations under the general laws of this state.

Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to construct, own, maintain and operate a line or lines of telephone in and throughout the towns of Harmony and Wellington, and within the limits aforesaid, to locate, construct and maintain its lines upon and along any public way, railroad, bridge, or private lands, but in such manner as not to discommode or endanger
